Ann. partner opportunities (lunch/challenge coin sponsor, impact statements) (Kendall) Youth SR Vote: Last meeting, we voted in new members for CEC. We had three youth interested in serving on the Executive Committee. They all came in and interviewed with staff. They all shared why they are interested in MADC. All three youth submitted statements of intent for CEC to review and vote on; however, one youth did not meet the deadline so we have two letters of intent to vote on: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Sydney: She asked Hailey for her contact information at the Sticker Shock Campaign in October 2022 and reached out to Hailey months later, interested in MADC membership and volunteering with the coalition. 2. Arjun: Volunteered at Public Safety Day with his sister. He worked the Natural High Booth and did a very good job engaging with the public. He reached out to staff after learning about the Youth Sector Representative position at MYAC. Any thoughts or questions? (Anne) Did they seem like they could co-work together? (Kendall) We mentioned to each of them the possibility of co-serving, but we can double check to see if they would want to serve together. (David) We need someone who can step up and speak in hearings during the legislative session. (Danielle) If there’s a possibility they can serve together. (Susie) How old are they and where do they go to school? (Hailey) They are both juniors at RHS. (Cheryl) If they can both serve it would be a great, in the past it has been really successful.

(Hailey) We have seen Arjun speak in a public setting during a MYAC meeting and he does extremely well. (David) Arjun may be able to engage others involved with MYAC to engage other schools. (Peggy) Have you only had one Youth Sector Rep. in the past? (All) Yes. (David) The coalition's success is from all of us. It is because we all step in and step up when we need too. If they can show that they can work together, that is what we really need. (Susie) Make them understand that they are equals (Anne) We need to stress that we don't want to lose either one and that's why we are trying to figure it out and hopefully can have both serve. (Brenda) By having two individuals, that is adding to adolescents in the schools and that's where we really need to start to get more involved with youth. Spoke with Luke Cavenar and he accepted to be the MC of the event. We have discussed back-up plans as well in case because of conflicts with his job and legislative work. (David) How is his health? Helped out at Mountain View High School event that showed the Do You Know Vape? Documentary. Set up the brain and provided education and resources. The event was after Memorial Day, 10 adults, 6 students showed. Just shows that is can be difficult to get people there.</p> <p>(Brenda) Regards to 20-year anniversary planning, we have Cyclebar and Sportsman’s donating during their third quarter. Working with two different vendors for flowers. The sign will depend on who is donating so that is still is in the works. Region 4 Behavioral Health board update: met with Ross Edmunds, they are going to help us temporarily. No meeting in July, but normal meetings will start back up in August. Thinks things will move forward.</p> <p>(Kendall) Idaho State Police forensic toxicology trends. 86% of toxicology tests had at least one drug in the sample. Adult vs. juvenile toxicology DUI cases, number of drug compounds present: single drug adults– 50%, 73% for juveniles. Multiple drugs: adult- 43%, 19% juveniles. Central nervous system stimulants were the most confirmed type of drug in adult toxicology samples, cannabinoids were next, followed by CSN depressants and narcotic analgesics. 76% of the juvenile cases tested contained cannabinoids. Most common drugs of 2022: 1. amphetamine/methamphetamine 2. Cannabinoids 3. Fentanyl/Norfentanyl.</p> <p>(Kelsey) confirmed availability to help with media at 20 Yr.</p> <p>(Earl) Approached Counsel of Catholic Women. Kendall will be setting up a meeting to discuss speaking opportunities. Attended Summer Reading Kickoff. We had 170 prevention conversations. Got a lot of newsletter sign ups. Thought about maybe having a Veterinarian (Intermountain Vet Hospital – Dr. Brett Bingham) coming in to speak with the group about vet medicines and diversion/abuse of medications like Ketamine and Xylazine.</p> <p>(All) Great idea for us to learn more.</p> <p>(Kendall) May be a good option to add safe disposal of pet medications on prescription take-back materials.</p> <p>(Danielle) Do vets have to sign into PDMP in order to prescribe medications?</p> <p>(Kendall) Not sure, but we can start making a list of questions for when we have Dr. Bingham come in.</p> <p>(Jake) absent</p> <p>(Kendall) Yoonwa and Kylee are off for the summer. RHS does not have linens for us to use for the Ann. celebration. In late July we’ll get WASD violation data that helps the coalition determine prevention strategies and applications for grants. WASD administration is determining if WASD will participate in the Idaho Healthy Youth Survey. Participation is important as it is the only source of valid local youth driven data.</p> <p>(David) CCI went through a bit of bump with the DFC grant. Not being under thumb of grants has been a bit of relief and there is a potential for CCI a bit of money left over and we are currently applying for a no-cost extension. The community has really stepped up to help support CCI. Did good with Idaho Gives,</p>
